WHAT WE DO

We offer programs to individuals with autism across the lifespan. Our programs are tailored to foster socialization, create community and connection. We also develop Autism 101 trainings for the community and provide resources to families in need.

SPEAKER SERIES

We offer free educational discussions on a quarterly basis that empower parents, professionals and students with current information about autism. Our Speaker Series features experts in the field of autism sharing their knowledge to increase advocacy skills and bring together community.



We partner with AMC Theater at Foothills Mall to provide 50 complimentary tickets to those who attend Sensory Friendly Films. During the movie the lights are turned up, the sound is turned down and families can bring their own snacks.

TEEN MEET UPS

We partnered with Playformance, a gym that is play based to provide a place for teens to meet up once a month. During the meet up, two coaches facilitate team building, taking turns and teaching solutions for working together. Parents have said their teen, "enjoys coming and doesn't want to miss one."



SONORAN DOLPHINS

Saguaro Aquatics provides swimming lessons specifically designed for children with autism. Our collaborative partnership has created a unique water safety and swimming program that allows children with autism to feel comfortable and stay safe in the water.



SOCIAL CLUB

The Social Club meets once a month and provides an opportunity for adults with autism to socialize, develop friendships, and discuss life challenges.



STEAM CAMPS

We partnered with the University of Arizona to provide STEAM! (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) camps at the University. The camps are geared towards 8-16 year olds and provide parents with education trainings relating to transition programs.

INFO & REFERRAL



Through a survey conducted at the 2017 Autism Walk we learned from respondents that the autism communities' number one need is for comprehensive information for referral services.

INFORMATION & REFERRAL COMMITTEE

Following the 2017 walk, an information and referral (I&R) committee was created with psychologists, public administrators, developmental pediatrician nurses, BCBA's and behavioral health providers to create an informative Speaker Series program for 2018. This group led efforts on integrating a developmental surveillance screening algorithm on the website (as-az.org) as an additional resource for parents and medical providers.



ADVOCACY

Our Board of Directors is active in the autism community. Jared Perkins, is on the Governor's Committee for Autism Spectrum Disorder. Dr. Sydney Rice is a developmental pediatrician involved with the Arizona Developmental Disabilities Surveillance Program (ADDSP) and a member of the Governor's Committee for Autism Spectrum Disorder. Pete Schwarz chair's the Affiliate Leadership Committee for the Autism Society of America.



IMPACT: Sophie's Story

When we got stationed in Tucson through the military we had no idea that our daughter would be diagnosed with autism. We also had no idea what to do next in this new world. We decided that we had to fight and convince the military to relocate us to a base where she would thrive.

WE ARE SO GRATEFUL

We made endless phone calls and emails and still had no answer on what to do, until we heard about the Autism Society of Southern Arizona. As soon as we got their address, we drove over to the office without an appointment or phone call.



We walked in, said we needed help and got all the resources we needed. I am so incredibly happy to say that our daughter is now receiving ABA services along with her other therapies. It would have never happened if we didn't walk in to that office. Being a parent to a special needs child is hard, plain and simple, but the Autism Society of Southern Arizona provides support, help, empathy, inspiration, advice, and so much more.
