ZooBurst

ZooBurst is a digital storytelling tool that lets students easily create 3D pop-up books. It includes over 10,000 free images and materials. Authors can choose to make items "clickable," allowing readers to learn more about individual characters. Each character can have its own "chat bubble" that pops up when that character is clicked. Authors can also record their own voices to have their characters really "speak" when clicked!
