OUR PROGRAMS

NAVIGATING AUTISM PROGRAM

The Autism Society provides Information & Referral as one of our most important core services. We are typically the 'first call' parents or individuals with autism make upon hearing of a diagnosis of autism. We offer support, information on programs, services and educational resources. When needed, we provide referrals to other organizations that can assist those in need. In 2019, we hired our Information & Referral Bilingual Specialist. This expanded our resources to continue to further our mission and increase our capacity.





PLAYFORMANCE Youth and team meetups

The Playformance Teen and Youth meetups are an opportunity for children with autism to connect with their peers and stay active once a month. Playformance serves the whole person and supports our students as they develop the cognitive, physical, emotional, and social skills needed for a unified community. The group has increased in size month to month and serves 25-30 individuals per month.

SENSORY FRIENDLY FILMS

AMC Theatre Foothills Mall and ASSA partnered together to provide a more accepting and comfortable setting for individuals on the autism spectrum to enjoy films. ASSA provided 50-75 complimentary tickets prior to the show in front of the movie theater entrance. Through our community relationship, we partnered with Comcast to expand our Sensory Friendly film experiences to offer more sensory friendly entertainment options for families at their Tucson headquarters.





ADULT SOCIAL CLUB

Adults with autism come together and build relationship's through Tucson's social meet ups. The group holds meetings every third Friday of the month from 5:30 – 8:30 pm at 630 N. Craycroft Road. The discussions in the group range from living independently to navigating college life.

STEAM CAMP

The half day camps are geared towards 8-16-yearold's who enjoy building, exploring and learning. We partnered with the University of Arizona Biomedical Engineering Club to provide an annual STEAM! (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) camp on the University campus.

EQUINE THERAPY

Studies show that therapeutic riding can assist in improving communication, motor skills, ability to focus, social and behavioral interactions, while building strength and balance. TROT (Therapeutic Riding of Tucson) provides equine-assisted activities and therapies for children with physical and developmental disabilities. ASSA provided 5 equine therapy scholarships for children and teens with autism.





SONORAN DOLPHINS SWIM CLUB

This swim club provides a unique water safety and swimming lesson program that allows children with autism to feel at ease and successful in the water. We have a collaborative partnership with Saguaro Aquatics that provides swimming lessons for children with special needs. This program has been designed by Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBA's) and the swim instructors are trained how to safely and effectively conduct swimming lessons with children on the autism spectrum.


